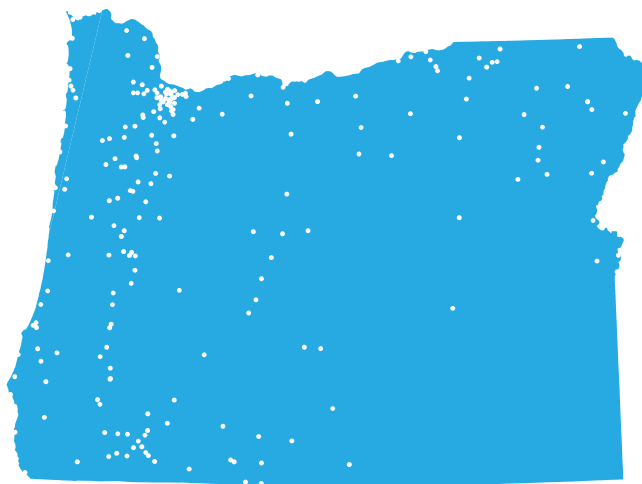


DID YOU KNOW?

Oregon libraries offer vital digital access and resources to their communities.

- 97% of Oregon libraries offer access to online job and employment resources
- 97% of Oregon libraries provide access to online homework assistance
- 91% of Oregon libraries provide access to E-books
